On the fourth Sunday of Advent (Advent IV), we celebrate God's faithfulness in sending Jesus, and we remember that faithfulness as we look forward to Christ's second coming.

Fourth Sunday of Advent Scripture Readings

Scripture readings for Advent IV focus on the coming of the Messiah who fulfills God's covenant with David, bringing salvation for all people and the eternal reign of God on earth.

- Old Testament Readings Isaiah 7:10, 7:14, 2 Samuel 7:1, Micah 5:4.
- Readings from Psalms 80:1, 89:1, 89:3, 89:19
- New Testament readings Romans 1:2, Hebrews 10:9-10.
- Gospel Readings Matthew 1:18, 1:21, 1:22, Luke 1:26, 1:32-33,

Fourth Sunday of Advent Prayer

The Advent season is a journey through the biblical story that shows us how "all the promises of God find their Yes in [Christ]" (2 Corinthians 2:20). Advent points us to Jesus, just like all Scripture. At his first coming, which we celebrate at Christmas, Jesus showed us his humility, his love for us, and his heart of grace toward sinners and sufferers.
